

1. CALL TO ORDER – Chairman Stokes called the meeting to order at 11:30 a.m.
2. CONSIDERATION OF AND ACTION ON THE APPROVAL OF THE FINALIZED LEPC SUBGRANT APPLICATION - Communication Chair Robert Hemminger advised the Committee that after reviewing the grant it was not the same grant the LEPC applied for a couple of years ago. This grant is the Hazardous Materials Emergency Planning Grant Program (HMEP), which is specifically for hazardous materials planning and training, and most commonly funds Commodity Flow Studies and HazMat Training Courses. Mr. Hemminger stated that we could try to articulate in the grant application that the pocket guides and residential/business packets are hazardous materials resource guides.


Motion was made by Robert Hemminger and seconded by Christina Perez to approve and submit the LEPC Subgrant application. Motion carried unanimously.
